Joint Project Write-up Instructions (ONE PER TEAM)

Before submitting your joint project, make sure that everything is **labelled**. Remember that you must have muscles, tendons, ligaments, cartilage, and bones in your joint, but you must give its **specific name**. For example, if you are working on the knee joint, do not write 'ligament' as a label... research it to see its actual name (it could be the anterior cruciate ligament, or posterior cruciate ligament, etc).




You will definitely need to do research to properly label all components of your joint, or to see how it moves. As you find helpful information from websites and books, **you need to keep track of it!**

See the last pages of this handout for instructions on how to properly format a bibliography.

For your writeup, you should write approximately 1-2 pages (double spaced) in which you do the following:

- Specify the joint you have selected and present any notable facts about it you may have come across while researching.
- Explain the different materials that you chose for each component. Jusify your choice of materials by describing the materials' **mechanical properties**. Do they have similar properties to the real life components?
- Conclude your write-up by suggesting ways in which your joint could have been more realistic.
- Staple a bibliography to the back page, along with each of your peer evaluation slips. You only need to have one joint and write-up per team, but each individual team member must submit a peer evaluation slip. Working by yourself? Then you don't need this slip!
